George Harvey Riley, Jr., age 78, of Lewes, DE passed away peacefully on Monday, February 11, 2013 at Beebe Medical Center in Lewes. He was born in Baltimore, MD, on January 31, 1935, son of the late George Harvey Riley, Sr. and Mildred Elizabeth (Eckert) Riley. In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by two brothers: Kenneth Riley and Donald Riley.
