Paul A. Spragg, age 85, of Lewes, DE passed away on Friday, February 1, 2013 at Beebe Medical Center, Lewes, DE. He was born in Wilmington, DE on June 1, 1927, son of the late Paul A. Spragg, Sr. and Nellie M. (Walsh) Spragg.

Mr. Spragg was a graduate of the Wharton School of Business, University of Pennsylvania. Upon graduating, he was employed as a sales executive, first with the Speakman Company in Wilmington and retiring from North East Plumbing of Maryland. Mr. Spragg moved from Earleville, MD to Lewes in June of 2012. He loved sailing and boating, especially on the Chesapeake Bay. 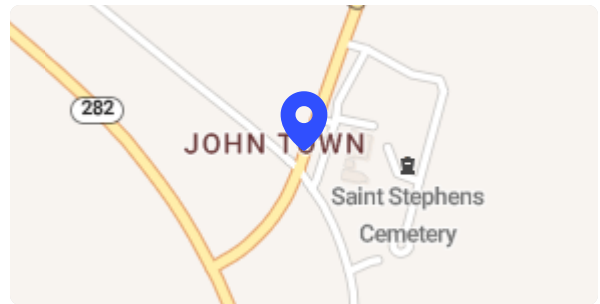
