Edna H. Agnew, age 88, of Salisbury, MD passed away peacefully on Saturday, December 10, 2011, at Coastal Hospice At The Lake. She was born in Washington, D.C. on January 27, 1923; daughter of the late Joseph Lester and Viola (Meade) Hall. In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by her husband, Anthony Agnew in 1992.

Mrs. Agnew spent her last years in Salisbury, MD, but was a longtime resident of Lewes after retiring from the National Institutes of Health in Bethesda, MD.
