Ernest C. King, age 76, of Georgetown, DE, died Thursday, June 25, 2009, at Nanticoke Memorial Hospital, Seaford, DE. Mr. King had retired as an Operations Instructor after over 38 years service with the San Diego California Transit System. He had served in the Marine Corps during the Korean War and was a member of the VFW. He was born on August 22, 1932 in Georgetown, DE son of the late John L. King and Eva E. Moore King.
