**J**ohn A. Engler, DDS, age 82, of Dagsboro, DE, passed away Tuesday, June 16, 2009, at Beebe Medical Center in Lewes, DE. He was born July 16, 1926 in Wilkes Barre, PA, son of the late George and Arlene (Groff) Engler.

Dr. Engler graduated from Bucknell University and Temple University School of Denistry. Following completion of his education, he taught for two years at Temple University Radiology Department.
