Philomena Sette Brillante, age 89, of Bowie, MD, formerly of Rehoboth Beach, DE, passed away Saturday, November 22, 2008 at Doctor's Community Hospital, Lanham, MD. Mrs. Brillante was born June 6, 1919 in Renovo, PA, daughter of the late Domenick and Julia (DelPozzo) Sette.
