**C**harles W. Ackley, III, (Tucker) age 65, of Lewes, DE died Thursday, May 25, 2006, at Beebe Medical Center in Lewes following a long illness. Tucker was active in the real estate business since 1962. His paternal great-grandfather, New Jersey Senator John A. Ackley, began their Real Estate career in Vineland, NJ in 1884. Tucker resided and worked in Vineland before moving to Lewes where he continued in Real Estate, ultimately joining the Remax Agency in Lewes.

Tucker had attended Vineland High School, the Bordentown Military Academy, and had served 4 years in the National Guard.

He was on the Advisory Board of Casa San Francisco and often helped with kitchen duties at Thanksgiving.
