Daniel P. Jones, 75, died Sunday, January 8, 2006 at Lofland Lifecare in Seaford, DE surrounded by his family. He was born July 22, 1930 in Bridgeville, DE son of the late Horace and Wilma (Williamson) Jones. He was a lifetime resident of Bridgeville.
