Walter (Walt) I. Diller, age 78 of Millsboro, DE and formerly of Mechanicsburg, PA, passed away suddenly on Thursday November 8, 2018 at Beebe Hospital in Lewes, DE. He was born on May 6, 1940 in Shiremanstown, PA, son of the late Boyd E. and Sara E. Diller.

Walt attended Cumberland Valley High School in Mechanicsburg, PA. He worked for Boyd E. Diller, Inc. as a vice president. He also was the president of "Cumberland Valley Land Clearing, Inc. and Cumberland Valley Drilling and Blasting, Inc. As a licensed blaster Walt always said he had a blast of a day.
