Evelyn Mary Christopher, age 88 of Rehoboth Beach, DE, formerly of Potomac, MD, passed away on Saturday, December 1, 2018, at her home. She was born on June 3, 1930 in Washington, DC, daughter of the late Edwin Casper Jacobson and Elizabeth Mary (Mack) Jacobson.

Mrs. Christopher grew up in Bethesda, MD and graduated from Immaculata High School. She attended the University of Maryland, where she earned a Bachelor's Degree and met her beloved husband, George E. Christopher, Sr., with whom she shared 67 wonderful years. He preceded her in death just this past October.

Mrs. Christopher was a devout Catholic and attended mass daily. She loved nature, taking long walks, and feeding her birds, squirrels, foxes and bunnies in her backyard. 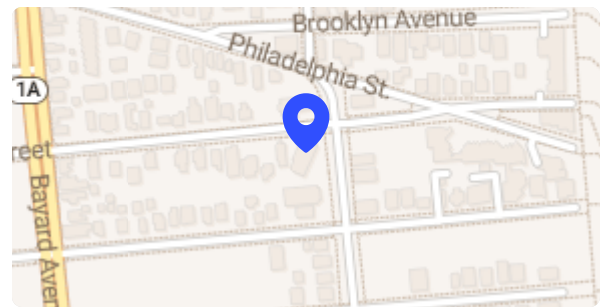
