Robert Stephen Didden, age 82 of Bethany Beach, DE, passed away peacefully on the morning of February 3, 2021 at his home. He was born on September 2, 1938 in Washington, DC, son of the late Albert J. Sr. and Regina Didden.

Bob attended Blessed Sacrament Elementary School and Saint John's College High School, Washington, DC, where he was a Lieutenant Adjutant in the Cadet Corps. He entered the Christian Brothers teaching order after high school and earned undergraduate and graduate degrees from LaSalle University. While with the Christian Brothers, Bob taught high school in Canton, OH. His faith was a cornerstone throughout his life.

Bob subsequently left the Christian Brothers and taught at Our Lady of Good Counsel High School in Wheaton, MD. He then joined the DOD Teaching Program and taught in Iceland, Japan, Germany, and Bermuda. Bob spent the last 25 years of his career in St. George's, Bermuda, teaching at Roger B Chaffee High School at the US Naval Air Station. As a certified SCUBA instructor, observant naturalist, skilled fisherman, and daring water-skier, he shared his love of the water with all.

Bob retired to South Bethany Beach, DE in 1994 and provided summer housing for many visiting international students working summer jobs. He had many talents and enjoyed music, poetry, painting, literature, and travel. He treasured his relationships with "his family," be they relatives, students, coworkers, or visitors. Continuing contact with many through Facebook and phone calls, and hearing about their lives, greatly enriched his own. In Bob's own words, "To be remembered by those who have brought happiness into our lives is truly inspirational and uplifting. Please accept my gratitude and continue to use the incredible power within you".

We will miss his keen insight, wit, and friendship to all. He now lives in peace and joy.

In addition to his parents, Bob was preceded in death by his sister, Regina Mitchell and her husband Colonel Jim Mitchell; and his brother-in-law, John Gibbs. He is survived by his brother,

Hi Everyone,I composed this description of Robert's fishing escapade last week and thought today would be a good day to share it with you, on the anniversary of his death.Robert's Fishing Escapade Under Chain Bridge On The Potomac River In 1956One day my brother, Robert, and his friend Steven decided to go fishing on the Potomac River. They were either juniors or seniors at St. John's College High School in Washington, DC in about 1955 or 1956.They thought they had planned their escapade down to the last detail. Robert got dressed for school in his St. John's uniform that he wore every day to school. He took a duffel bag with his clothes he needed for after school football practice. He told our mother that he might be late, as he had football practice.Everything almost worked out. Robert went to school and since school let out early that day (which he already knew would happen), he and Steven went fishing as planned up on the Potomac River. They rented a rowboat at Fletcher's Boat House and rowed up the river near Chain Bridge where the fishing was better.The one thing Robert didn't plan on, was his grandmother. She and her friend, Freda, went out every Thursday for lunch and a drive and this Thursday she and Freda had been to Virginia and were returning to DC, and were driving across Chain Bridge, which crosses the Potomac river. Our grandmother looked down from the car window and spotted Robert and Steven in the rowboat.A few hours later, our grandmother phoned Mom and told her that she saw Robert and his friend fishing in a rowboat on the Potomac river near Chain Bridge.When Robert came home that evening, dressed back in his school uniform, he was dumbfounded when his mother asked him what was he doing fishing up under Chain Bridge, when he was supposed to be at school.What are the odds that Robert would go fishing under Chain Bridge on the very same day and time that his grandmother would be riding across the bridge?Valerie D. 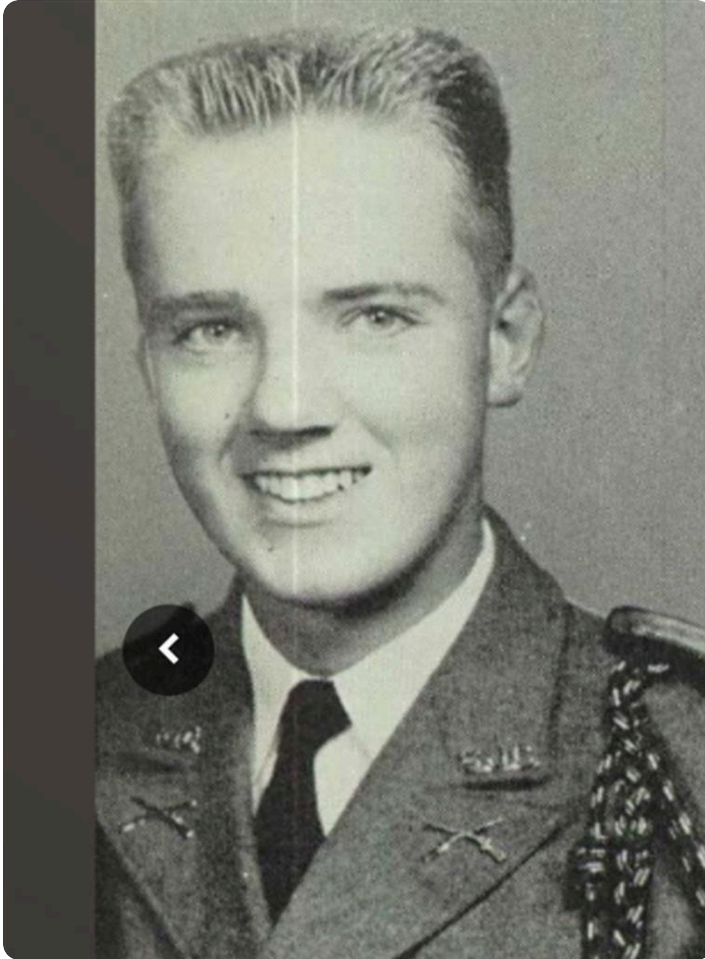
