Robert Paul Comeau, age 76 of Milton, DE passed away at home, surrounded by family, on Thursday, February 9, 2023, following a nine - year battle with frontotemporal dementia. He was born on August 30, 1946, in Somerville, MA, son of the late Paul and Albina (Vezina) Comeau.

Mr. Comeau was a graduate of Somerville High School, in MA, class of 1964. 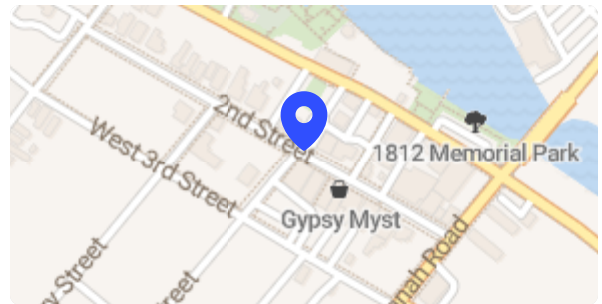
