**W**illiam A. Sheck Sr., "Mr. Bill" passed away peacefully on March 14, 2024, in hospice care at Delaware Hospice in Lewes, Delaware. Born on March 21, 1928, in Baltimore, Maryland. He lived to the ripe age of 95.

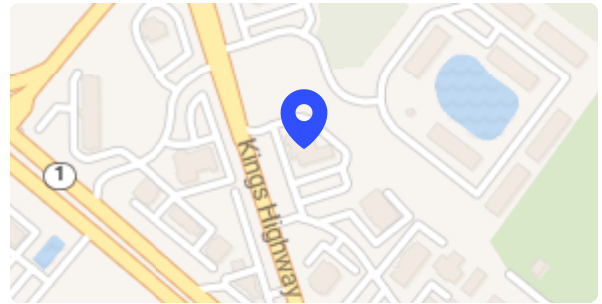

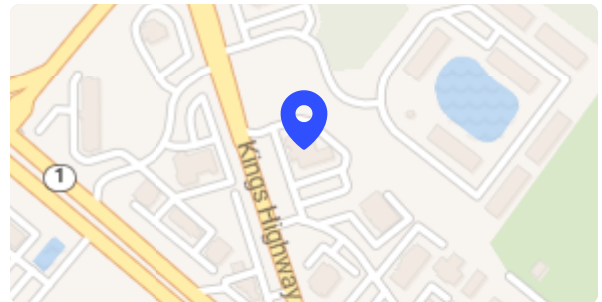
