David Gerald Mooney, of Georgetown, DE, passed away peacefully at home surrounded by his loving family on Saturday, May 31, 2025, at the age of 82. Born on February 13, 1943, in Etna, PA, he was the son of the late Grace and Peter J. Mooney. On October 24, 1964, Dave married the love of his life, Irene, with whom he shared a devoted and joyful life.

Dave worked as a superintendent at the Chrysler plant and retired after 30+ years of dedicated service. 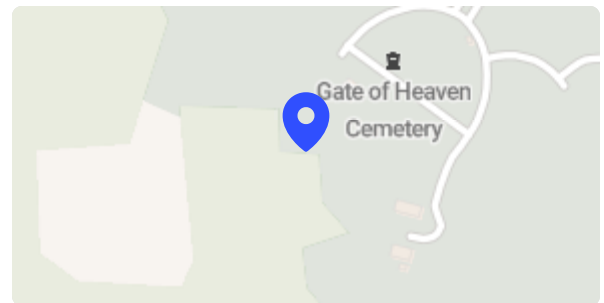
