Elaine D. (Perry) Masterson, age 86 of Ocean View DE, passed away peacefully on Saturday May 1, 2021 in the supportive care of Delaware Hospice. Elaine was born in Philadelphia, PA in 1934, daughter of the late William and Irene (Hess) Perry.

Elaine was a registered nurse, having graduated from Memorial Hospital School of Nursing in the Roxborough area of Philadelphia, PA in 1955. She was a dedicated caregiver for the entirety of her career in the Doylestown, PA area.
